EASTERN MASS. TO GET FOUR NEW OVERLAY TELEPHONE CODES

By now, nearly everyone is aware that four new area codes have been assigned to overlay the current four area codes in eastern Massachusetts. On April 2, 2001, new area code 857 will overlay the current 617 area code; 339 will overlay 781; 351 will overlay 978 and 774 will overlay 508.

WHAT IS NOT CHANGING:

- · Your telephone number won't change; you'll keep your current area code and telephone number.
- As new services and new customers are added and we run out of number in today's area codes, new area codes will be assigned.
- A local call is still a local call.
- A toll call is still a toll call.
- Rates wont change as a result of the new area code.
- You still get emergency assistance by dialing only 9-1-1.

WHAT IS CHANGING:

- The way you dial calls, you now MUST dial the area code beginning April 2.
- Even if you dial a 1 before the area code, local calls will still go through as a local call.

REMEMBER

Reprogram any automatic dialing equipment like:

- Speed dialers
- Computers you use for Internet access
- Modems
- Fax machines
- Building entry systems
- Elevator emergency phones
- Tell customers and business associates and employees.
- Customers with alarm systems should contact their alarm company to arrange for any required reprogramming.
